Our Main Goal


Each day there will be a special focus, it could be the civil war, civil rights movements or the history of government. Here at NCI we strive to bring these topics alive through group learning and discussion.

Accommodations

At Nature's Classroom Institute we stay just outside of DC in the Blue Ridge Mountains, just a 45 minute drive away but distance enough to disconnect and unwind. The shared cabin environment promotes community and allows the students new opportunities for discussion and reflection. These beautiful settings provide an appealing break from the city and a home base for the students to rest, regroup and settle.





What Our Accommodations Include:

- Visiting schools will sleep in shared weatherized cabins that have AC and heating.
- All cabins include restroom and shower facilities.
- Meals are provided either on site or in the form of sack lunches.
- Nature trails and outdoor space is available for all to enjoy.

Onsite Activities

Every evening after dinner the students will participate in historical simulations, putting themselves in the shoes of others, they could be taking on the role of a towns person in Concord, forced to choose between loyalty to the King of England or help the local Minutemen. They could be a Native American walking the Trail of Tears or an Immigrant having just arrived on a boat from Europe.

You may also choose to spend more time onsite offering a break from the city. Choosing instead for the NCI staff to teach classes to further support learning, development and understanding.



Meals



All trips are tailor made and specific to the needs of our visiting schools. Below is a selection of some stops and attractions that can be included into your schedule

Alexandria: Walk the beautiful streets and follow in the footsteps of many of our Founding Fathers.

Arlington National Cemetery: Pay your respects to the vast amount of brave men and women who sacrificed their lives.

Capitol Hill: Walk the underground tunnels where lawmakers meet, explore the Visitor Center (by appointment), take in the miles of books at the Library of Congress, and sit on the steps of the highest court in the land, the U.S. Supreme Court.

Embassy Row: Ride through this impressive street that is lined with more than 100 foreign embassies.

FDR Memorial: Learn how Franklin D. Roosevelt connected the American people during the Great Depression.

Ford's Theatre and Petersen House: Follow the mystery of Lincoln's assassination. (Additional Charge and by appointment only)

Holocaust Museum: Experience the Holocaust through "Daniel's Story" at this living memorial to the victims of Nazi Germany. Iwo Jima Memorial: Explore this tribute to the U.S. Marines who died while serving our country.

Jefferson Memorial: Read some of Jefferson's famous writings.

Korean War Veterans Memorial: Walk among 19 statues, each depicting a soldier in realistic garb, as they marched through Korea.

Lincoln Memorial: Stand where Martin Luther King, Jr., stood when he delivered his famous "I Have a Dream" speech.

Martin Luther King, Jr. National Memorial: Experience the newest memorial dedicated to the famous civil rights activist.

Mount Vernon: Explore George Washington's estate. (Additional Charge and by appointment only)

National Archives: See the Constitution, Bill of Rights, and Declaration of Independence.

Pentagon Memorial: Visit the memorial honoring the 184 victims of the September 11, 2001, attacks at the Pentagon.

Smithsonian Institution: Take your pick from several world class museums for your students to explore.

Vietnam Veterans Memorial: 58,000 names inscribed on the Wall, representing the many who were killed or missing in action.

Washington Monument: (picture stop) Snap some photos in front of the world's tallest stone monument.

White House: Take a picture standing in front of the most recognizable symbol of the presidency.

World War II Memorial: Deepen your appreciation for the 16 million who served and 400,000 who lost their lives in battle while fighting to protect our rights and freedoms.



Additional Options:

- Washington D.C is less than an hour away, it is simple and easy to include a trip to the nations capitol to explore the world class museums, monuments and other attractions
- Gettysburg is also less than an hour away, a full day can be spent here exploring one of the worlds most famous battlefields.
- There are multiple other Civil War battlefields close to our site and can be added to any itinerary.
- We also have a wonderful amount of Native American history close by. Our Education Director will be able to show you all the options.
